## The Head of the Department welcomed the members of Committee.

The Department Consultative Committee (DCC) meeting held at the office of Director & Head, Department of Biotechnology, Anna University on 30/01/2018; 2.00 PM to discuss the following agendas : [1] M. Tech Teaching progress, [2] M. Tech projects, [3] Finance related works, [4] Research committee and other relevant matters.Based on the deliberate discussion with DCC members the following recommendations are noted to enhance the academic growth and governance of the department. The list of DCC members attended the meeting is attached.

1. Teaching fellows with Ph.D qualification are not entitled to guide M. Tech student thesis work but allowed to guide undergraduate thesis work. Once again, the teaching fellows without Ph.D degree are not encouraged to teach post graduate students.

- 2. M. Tech student projects will be allotted based on the consensus of a faculty and students. The student with high CGPA will be prioritized when more than one student is interested to work with a faculty. In particular, minimum of one student from M. Tech – Biotechnology must be assigned to all the faculty.
- 3. Thesis grant and consumables from DBT supported M. Tech Biotechnology program will be spent only to M. Tech - Biotechnology students. However it was recommended to request funds from university towards the cost of consumables for Biopharma & Food Tech students.
- 4. A separate external committee to evaluate and recommend M.S./Ph.D research works for synopsis/thesis submission is not encouraged. However, the existing open presentation before synopsis submission can be motivated further by participation of all faculty of the department. Presentation should be scheduled only on Friday afternoon and maximum faculty may be requested to attend the meeting.
- 5. The Department of Biotechnology, Anna University submitted a proposal to AICTE to approve M. Tech-Biopharmaceutical technology and M. Tech-Food Technology programs.
